- Ron Vogt is the counselor who saved Pete & Geri's marriage. I personally saw Ron over a span of three years as a single. He counsels both couples and individuals. If at all possible, I would recommend anyone interested in growing in emotional health to see Ron at least once. In one meeting, Ron is able to offer insight and advice about who you are that you will digest and ponder for YEARS. My wife and I saw Ron once right before we got married, and that one meeting spared us from over 65% of arguments that we might've had otherwise. To this day, we still quote from things that Ron shared with us in that first meeting. Using a diagnostic test called the MCMI-3, Ron is able to know a lot about you in a short time. He was able to predict for me and Heeyoung our future conflicts and trouble-spots and offer advice on how to work through them. Ron is not cheap. For a first meeting with a client, he recommends a 2-hour session. It's \$115 per hour. Plus, the MCMI-3 diagnostic test costs \$300. As a result, your first meeting with Ron will run around \$530. If you're an engaged or married couple it will cost around \$945. \$300 x 2 for two MCMI-3 tests + 3-hours of counseling time: 1-hr for each partner + a third hour together. I have recommended Ron to people who live on a very tight budget and they always say the money was well worth it. One of my friends who comes from a working class background said, "That was the best \$500 I've ever spent in my life." Again, there are no guarantees with counselors, but out of the 8 people I have referred to Ron, none have ever felt that they didn't get their money's worth. Again, if you're sincerely interested in growing in emotional health and authenticity in Christ, I would recommend that you use up a vacation day at work, drive the 1-2 hour drive to Mt. Gretna, PA, and have a 2-hour session with Ron. Marilyn, his secretary, will send a MCMI-3 multiple choice test to you which you fill out and then mail back to Ron's office one week before your appointment.
- Ron has both a Ph.D. in counseling and a M.Div. from seminary—an M.Div. is the degree that most pastors get. That's one of the reasons he's so good. Sometimes counselors without a strong theological background can get caught up in feel-good psycho-babble. Ron is solidly grounded theologically and biblically.
